<u>Attendance</u>

Information from the old school log books:

- In 1892 Average attendance was 67%
- On 5th February 59% attendance. Smallpox prevalent in the neighbourhood and parents afraid. The caretaker fumigated the school with carbolic acid every day.
- In 1894 3 x 2/6 books given to children with 100% attendance.
- 25 Jan 1907 –79.9%
- 25 Jan 2007 –86.4%
- 25 Jan 2017 –94.4%
- In January 2018 attendance fell to 93.9%. Many students were absent with coughs, colds, sickness and flu however 31 students still have 100% attendance. The cost of rewarding for 100% attendance has risen from 2s6d to £5!

Whole School Attendance this academic year is currently 94% against our target of 95.5%.
