Ripon Grammar 121-6 (18 overs) Leo Wilson 4-8, Rachael Hattan 1 wicket.



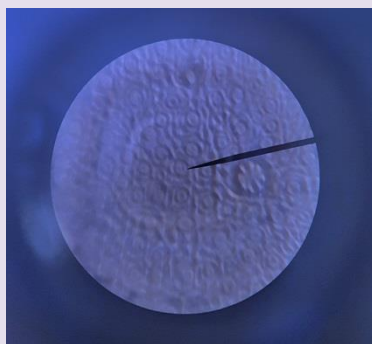
Race for Life
