The academic year 2017-18 has been an incredible year of achievements for Team Nidderdale. Back in October, our Ofsted visit and subsequent report recognised our progress on our journey to excellence with the school being described as 'Good and improving further'. Since then, we have achieved so much more.

A record number of Classcharts points have been awarded, with 92% of those points being positive. 336 students have been recognised as Nidderdale STARs and over 500 certificates of achievement have been awarded.

Students have represented the school through drama, music, science, maths, technology and sport in a range of local, regional and national competitions and school events. They have had the opportunity to visit theatres, universities, museums, galleries, agricultural and sporting events.

Students have also turned their minds to supporting others with some fantastic fund raising efforts. This year we have raised money for a wide range of charities including: Children in Need, Save the Children, Sport Relief, MacMillan, Guide Dogs for the Blind and, most recently, Cancer Research with an incredible Race for Life Team Nidderdale entry raising over £2000.

Team Nidderdale has also shown incredible resilience this year having faced all extremes of weather! We've overcome heavy snow, giant icicles, a leaking roof and failed hot water supplies earlier in the year and more recently we have experienced more hot weather than we know what to do with. Our Sports Day was a fantastic example of Nidderdale Team spirit in the sunshine which made a welcome change from shivering in damp gravel.

We are so we very proud of the achievements of all of our students and staff. We are grateful for the incredible support we receive from parents and the local community.

I would like to wish every member of the school community a most enjoyable and relaxing summer break and we will look forward to welcoming students back to school on Tuesday 4th September.



#### Year 5/6 Maths Activity Afternoon

Recently 8 students from St Cuthbert's and Coppice primary schools visited Nidderdale High to spend the afternoon using maths to answer some important questions. ### **Uniform & Equipment**

#### **Uniform Expectations**

A reminder that students wishing to wear a skirt MUST wear the official school skirt with the 'N' logo. The skirt can be purchased from stockists: Rawcliffes or Smart Start. Please see recent letter detailing the changes made to uniform and removal of pencil skirts.

For boys and girls, trousers must be tailored. Slim fit, skinny, jeggings and leggings are not permitted.

All students must wear proper school shoes—canvas shoes, trainers or boots are not acceptable.

Blazers and ties should be worn correctly to and from school and around the building at all times. Students will be permitted to remove their blazers in the classroom if they seek the teacher's permission.

The only jewellery permitted is one pair of small, plain studs or sleepers, worn one in each earlobe. Students are not allowed to wear nose studs or any other form of facial or body piercing.

If students do not arrive to school in correct uniform they will be sanctioned accordingly. Students will be supported to ensure they are wearing their uniform correctly at the start of each day. After this they will receive a sanction if uniform is incorrect.
