You may have read about some of our individual student successes in the Harrogate Advertiser and Nidderdale Herald - including our 4 students who managed to achieve 44 Grade 7-9 between them! We are really proud of all of our students and look forward to welcoming last year's Head Boy and Head Girl back to our Open Evening next Thursday to talk about what Nidderdale High School has meant to them.

Our new Year 7 students have made a great start. With a 99% Classcharts positive record, they have demonstrated their commitment to being Ready, Respectful and Safe. The rest of the school has a very impressive 96% positives record, with most students still on a 'Clean Slate' for Ready, Respectful and Safe.

At the start of this term the whole school community has been reflecting on the importance of the way we deal with others, thinking about the Golden Rule of treating others as we would like to be treated ourselves. #### **University Trips**

Year 8 - Fri 18th October, Sheffield University.

**History Film Event.** At this event, students will have the opportunity to watch the film 'Who Framed Roger Rabbit?' and explore how it functions as an allegory for racial segregation in the United States in the late 1940s. Students will work in groups to explore how these themes are developed in the film and examine the historical context on which the story is based.
