A PARTING GIFT FROM NIDDERLICIOUS

Mrs Naylor has kindly agreed to pass on her special recipe for school flapjack for you to make at home. Many of us are missing these and school pizza(!) during lockdown.

FLAPJACKS

- 75g (3oz) butter or block margarine
- 50g (2 oz) light soft brown sugar
- 30ml (2level tbsp) golden syrup
- 175g (6oz) rolled oats Makes 8-10

1. Grease a shallow 18 cm (7 inch) square tin
2. Melt the butter with sugar and syrup in saucepan over a low heat, then pour it on to the rolled oats. Mix well, turn the mixture into the prepared tin and press down well.
3. Bake in the oven at 180C (350C) for about 20 mins until golden brown. Cool slightly in the tin, mark into fingers with a sharp knife and loosen round the edges.
4. When firm, remove from the tin and cool on a wire rack, then break into fingers.
