Staff Training Day - 3rd July 2020

Headteacher's Introduction

Dear Parent / Carer

This week we have started the process of welcoming Year 10 students back to school, in line with our focus on wellbeing, all students have been offered a 1:1 meeting either online or in school to talk through experiences, review what's been going well and think about next steps. We hope that this has now helped those students returning for face to face English and Maths teaching next week feel more confident about how they will move forward.

You may have seen that the Government have made a slight change to their regulations about who can attend school. It is now possible for schools to invite students from any year group for a one-off meeting. Having used the 1:1 online meetings so successfully with Year 10, we now plan to extend this to all of Year 9. Having reviewed our group sizes in school again and the relatively large number of staff who need to be in school to work with students in school because of our small classrooms, we have decided that it is a far better use of everyone's time and fairer to everyone to offer online appointments to everyone rather than in school appointments to a very small number. Year 9 parents have received more information about this already. We will explore ways of extending this invitation to other year groups if we are able to.

We continue to be amazed by the incredible work that students are doing through their home learning and staff across all subjects are really enjoying sharing with each other the fantastic outcomes being produced. This is something that has been a real positive for us during school closure time. Thank you for all you continue to do to support your children at home.
