The school's focus on wellbeing was recognised with a national award last week at the first online award ceremony for the National Association of Pastoral Care in Education. The school was nominated in the Pastoral Development of the Year category. Covid Reminders

- If you are considering a holiday abroad during half term, please do keep a close check on quarantine restrictions, which are being updated all the time. Please do not book holidays to destinations already on the quarantine list as your child will not be able to return to school for 14 days after your return.
- Thank you to all families who are supporting our modified uniform expectations. Students are permitted to wear any black v-neck or crew neck jumper under their blazer to keep warm whilst we are keeping all classroom windows open. Students do require a coat as they are spending the majority of their social time outside.
- Children aged 11 and over are legally required to wear a face covering on public transport in England, unless exempt for health, age or disability reasons. The Local Authority and the school bus companies also require all young people to wear a face covering for their full journey. The 'Hands. Face. Space.' campaign urges everyone to continue to wash their hands, cover their face and make space to control infection rates. The NHS has released a 'Hands. Face. Space.' video that may be a useful resource when communicating the importance of wearing a face covering on transport directly to children and young people.

Any EU citizens without this status will not be able to work, study, rent housing, or claim many welfare benefits.
