As we continue to focus on work on supporting all young people to fully reconnect with their learning and the school community, I wanted to make you aware of some staffing updates to enhance this aspect of our work.

At the end of October Mrs Fiona Hirst joined our team as Pastoral Support Officer and has very quickly made a positive impact within our school community, providing support across all year groups, work as part of the Pastoral Team. At the same time, Mrs Warner, our Senior Learning Mentor, has taken on the enhanced role of 1:1 tutor, providing tuition and support mainly in maths and currently focusing on Year 10/11 as part of our official 'Catch Up' plan. Mrs Warner is a qualified teacher and is providing additional support to students as 1:1 and in small groups.

We are also really fortunate that Ms Heather Tuffs has joined our team as a volunteer for a short period of time. As a qualified Outdoor Education instructor, she is able to support Mr Couldwell in expanding the provision of bespoke outdoor support for some of our students as part of our reconnection plan.


