

# **Introducing NiddVenture**

Over the past few years we have been building our Outdoor Education and outdoor learning offer as Mr Couldwell has led both Key Stage 4 full year programmes and Key Stage 3 short courses based on building confidence, team-work and developing self-esteem and purpose.

During this year we have been working on plans to extend this aspect of our curriculum further and we are excited to be launching NiddVenture in September 2021. Mr Couldwell and Ms Tuffs will continue to offer similar programmes to those run this year but they also have some exciting plans to set up some community support activities, capitalising on the success of Ms Tuffs' amazing volunteering work over the past 18 months. We will also be offering lots more bespoke sessions for students requiring additional support, pastoral intervention and different ways of learning.

Across the year we will also be exploring ways to enable all of our students to learn in and through our amazing surroundings. All subject areas will be considering how they can develop threads of outdoor learning in their curriculum plans. This cannot happen quickly and it is a part of our long term development plan but we are excited to get started.
