### **Mobile Phones**

During last academic year, as part of our reconnection work, we relaxed some of our rules around mobile phone use during social time. As we begin our new academic year, we will now be returning to our original mobile phone policy, which requires all phones to be switched off and away from sight at all times. All students have been updated about this policy this week. As so many of our young people travel on buses and have commitments immediately after school, we do not have any plans to put a complete ban in place.

On arrival at school, students should switch off their phones and put them away in their bag or blazer pocket. Students are not permitted to use their phone during the school day inside or outside unless they are given express permission from a member of staff. If a mobile phone is being used without permission, the student will be given the opportunity to hand in their phone for the remainder of the lesson or session without receiving a classcharts negative. We would be grateful for your support with this policy. Please do not contact your child directly via their mobile phone during school hours. Please contact school directly if you need your child to receive a message during the school day. If you do need to speak to your child urgently, we will always accommodate this.

### Covid Updates - Testing and isolation

Thank you for the support you have given to the on site LFD testing this week. All students should now have been issued with home testing kits and instructions for use. Please complete these tests twice weekly on Sunday / Wednesday evening or Monday / Thursday morning and continue to log the results using this link <a href="https://forms.office.com/r/KZrid9TWVF">https://forms.office.com/r/KZrid9TWVF</a> If the test is positive, please also email admin@nidderdale.n-yorks.sch.uk

Anyone who tests positive for Covid via LFT should isolate and get a PCR test to confirm the result, if this is also positive then isolation must be completed as advised by NHS Test and Trace. If it is negative then isolation can end.

The Local Authority and Public Health continue to advise that schools should send home any individual displaying Covid symptoms. Please do not send your child to school if they have any Covid symptoms and please do all that you can to arrange collection of your child should they need to go home.

As you will be aware, the rules for close contact isolation have now changed. If your child is identified by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact, they will be advised to take a PCR test but can continue to attend school. Although this is not compulsory, we would be grateful if you could also complete regular LFT tests at home, especially if the close contact is a member of the household.

### Covid Updates - Measures in school

Although most of the significant control measures have now been lifted, we are still asking students to sanitise their hands regularly and leaving windows open to increase ventilation. Some measures around entry to lunch, use of designated toilets and movement on staircases have also been retained to ease congestion. Students have been updated about these measures this week. We are delighted to have Finish with a Flourish fully established as part of our curriculum offer for Years 7-10. This year we look forward to extending the range of opportunities as we are able to run some mixed year group activities and as the year progresses we will also be inviting volunteers to support different activities.
