#### Friday 19th November - Walk or Cycle to School Event

At 28% above the UK average, road transport is the largest contributor to carbon emissions in the Harrogate District. Petrol and diesel cars produce gases that warm our atmosphere, which causes unpredictable and extreme weather conditions. This leads to many problems, not only for polar bears in the Arctic, but also right here on our doorstep with heavy rain and floods. We need to find a way to reduce the amount of fossil fuels we use, ideally down to zero.

On 19th November both primary and secondary schools across the district are asked to ditch their cars and walk or cycle to school. Those that live far away use public transport/car for part of the journey, then 'park and stride' the last mile. It all adds up!

The physical and mental health benefits of exercise are well known, with studies also showing that walking to school improves concentration and helps pupils arrive ready to learn. Making the journey on foot, by bike or using public transport means fewer vehicles on the road, benefitting the wider community with less traffic and cleaner air.

#### **Covid Reminders**

As you will be aware covid rates remain high in the Harrogate area and we would advise that you remain vigilant for symptoms over half term. The main symptoms of Covid 19 are:

- a fever (temperature 37.8C or higher),
- a new continuous cough,
- a change to/loss of taste or smell.
- Other commonly reported symptoms of the Delta variant include headache, sore throat, tiredness, and cold-like symptoms, so please be aware of these as well and stay at home and seek further testing if you are in any doubt.

All students have been issued with further LFD test kits today. National DfE advice and North Yorkshire Public Health guidance is that all students, staff and household members should continue to test and report reports twice weekly across the holiday.

North Yorkshire Public Health continue in their advice that face to face parent events should not be held in school at present. Year 7 parents have received a letter about the planned Pastoral Evening today.

We will communicate further guidance about wearing face coverings in school as we receive it.
