# Headteacher's Introduction Dear Parent / Carer

I would like to thank all students, staff and parents for the part they have played in trying to keep our school community as safe as possible during a period when we have seen an increase in Covid 19 positive cases. We continue to work closely with Public Health North Yorkshire to monitor cases in school and to be aware of infection rates in the local area. Next week the following measures will remain in place:

- hand hygiene and ventilation
- face coverings for all everywhere in the building (unless exempt) this measure will be reviewed and hopefully removed at the end of Friday 15.10.2021
- twice weekly Lateral Flow Testing and reporting for all staff and students
- students presenting with symptoms of Covid, including Delta variant common symptoms to stay at home and seek a PCR test

We are now able to revert to the normal timings of the school day with break and lunchtime at the same time for all students. The rota for lunch entry will be reviewed for after half term.

Finish with a Flourish will be back on the timetable next Friday, with the full range of activities available.


