Dear Parent / Carer

We have made a very busy start to the new half term with new NiddVenture intervention groups, joint work between Year 8 German and NiddVenture, Duke of Edinburgh training and expeditions, the Dales Cup and more Year 11 GCSE examinations. Recycling small electricals can make a big difference!

Did you know that anything with a plug, battery or cable can be recycled? If you have a small electrical appliance like a hairdryer, iron, kettle or toaster that doesn't work anymore and can't be repaired, you can take it to your local Household Waste Recycling Centre, Even very small items like electric toothbrushes, torches, and razors can be recycled. Battery powered items like calculators and toys too.

UK households are hiding an astonishing 527 million unwanted electricals. If all these items were recycled, it would cut as much CO₂ as taking 1.3 million cars off the road!

Inside electrical items are precious materials like gold, copper, steel and aluminium. If these items are binned rather than recycled, that potential to reuse those resources is lost forever. When you recycle waste electicals, recovered plastic and metals can be used to make new products - from bicycles and children's play areas to life-saving equipment.

As well as being able to take items to your local Household Waste Recycling Centre, you can also drop off your broken and unwanted small electricals at 20 participating libraries until 8 More July. at www.northyorks.gov.uk/SmallElectricals
