Dear Parent / Carer

What a year of achievements it has been. For all of us, it's the first time since 2018-19 that we have been able to complete a full year in the school building and for Years 8 & 9, it's their first ever non-closure year as part of Team Nidderdale. Of course, even this academic year we have had the challenges of Covid absence to contend with and we did have a few closure days when we were worst hit and this week's extreme weather-related closure - thank you to families for your support with this.

It has been so wonderful this term to be able to feel like we were emerging from survival mode and to share more of the things we used to take for granted with our students. Duke of Edinburgh expeditions - an incredible 60% of Year 9 and 25% of Year 10 and 11 have completed their Bronze Expedition this year. 
