It was many students' first experience of carrying all their kit, navigating independently & camping and we witnessed some superb displays of resilience, teamwork and problem solving. GCSE rock climbing students have had an evening session at Almscliff Crag and a full day at Bull Scar in Wharfedale to enable them to experience climbing on both gritstone and limestone.

We have continued to work with teaching staff from a range of subjects to integrate Niddventure opportunities across the curriculum. German has been the latest subject to embrace this and students have had the opportunity to visit Fishpond Wood and engage in a treasure hunt activity that involved following clues in German.
