DUKE OF EDINBURGH BRONZE – 2022/23 – KEY INFORMATION

What's involved?

Adventurous, caring, sporty, creative... however you might describe yourself, the DofE is for you. Anyone in the school year in which you turn 14, to aged 24 can take part. There are three progressive levels of programmes which when completed lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold DofE Award.

To achieve your Bronze Award, you'll need to complete your own programme of activities in these four sections (the expedition will be down in school!):



How long will it take?

Activities for each DofE section take a minimum of one hour per week over a set period of time, so they can be fitted in around your studies and life outside school.

You'll need to participate regularly and show that you're committed to your DofE during this time.



Key Dates

All sessions are compulsory as they form an essential part of the expedition training and our health and safety risk assessments. Below is a list of several dates that must be attended. Please be aware, some of these dates may have to be altered nearer the time due to unforeseen circumstances.

The Cost

It will cost £120 to carry out the award (this can be £250+ with other providers!) If your child receives Free School Meals then the cost will be £60.

You will need to pay the school via the Gateway in the following instalments:
