## **Skipton Castle Educational Visit**

Year 7 ventured to Skipton Castle on Monday 16th January on a Humanities Area of Learning trip, 933 years after the original castle was built. From the dungeon, ramparts, other defences and the banqueting hall and kitchen, students were given loads of detail to life in a castle throughout it's nearly 1000 years of history.

Students were guided around the various aspects of the castle, the information given to them complemented their History curriculum. This proved to be an opportunity to apply the facts and concepts from the History classroom directly to an actual historical site. Guides described both the layout and metamorphosis through history of the building, but also spoke of those who have lived there throughout the years.

Engagement was exemplary and it was especially pleasing to hear our young people asking probing and intuitive questions, much like all staff hear within their lessons, but now 'on tour'.

Following a lunch break, and not content with just an historical enquiry, our students then investigated the levels of congestion in Skipton through a traffic survey from different directions. This was then compared to their early experiences at school, measuring congestion in Pateley Bridge, during their Geography lessons. Year 7 continuing to impress with their application of geographical skills and application of previous learning in a different environment.
