We have also had a busy time working with vistors to the school in our continued reflections on how to ensure our provision for students is excellent. The feedback has been consistently positive, reflecting the emphasis on kindness and respect in positive relationships; identifying thoughtful curriculum planning; celebrating the success of some of the more innovative aspects of our curriculum which aim to be responsive to need and recognising the wealth of expertise, enthusiam and commitment of our staff team.
