Flourish Curriculum

We are now into the fourth year of our Flourish Curriculum.

The core activities for each year group have been launched.

- Year 7 will be continuing to work with Dr Binding on his connecting classrooms project where students consider their impact on the environment.
- Year 8 have started learning about emotional regulation which will help our students to recognise and acknowledge their own emotions.
- Year 9 will work with Ms Eglin, Careers Adviser to engage in discussions about their future options.
- Year 10 will use the time to develop their revision skills ready for their GCSE exams.

Alongside these core activities, students will take part in two activities of their own choice from a wide range of activities including our most popular sessions such as baking, bush-craft, crafts and photography. We have also included some new activities this year of girls' football, dog training and water-colour painting. The Flourish curriculum also offers an opportunity for the senior student leadership team to have regular meetings to plan school events and for Year 9 to start their D of E award.

It has already been fantastic to see both staff and students enjoying their Flourish Curriculum.

This week we presented our Flourish Curriculum as a case study for the Association for Pastoral Care at an online national conference. We shared how the curriculum has evolved over the last four years to include a wide variety of activities for our students. We discussed the feedback from students, staff and families including the positive impact on students' wellbeing, relationships between both peers and students and staff. We were able to share the positive responses received from external reviewers including OFSTED and how students have used their skills learnt during Flourish at home such as gardening and photography. Schools from across the country had the opportunity to ask questions about the organisation of the Flourish programme so they could consider how it might work in their own setting.

Expectations - Ready Respectful and Safe

Students have responded well to our slightly revised systems for ensuring ready, respectful and safe behaviour in school.

We have awarded 68606 positive points and 91% of all behaviour points issued are positive.

Please use the half term holiday to ensure all items of uniform and equipment have been purchased. Hoodies are not permitted in school and students should bring a proper coat to school for the colder weather. Most students are already complying with this expectation but a small number of students are still wearing a hoodie in school.

We have focused on behaviour choices on the buses this half term with a reminder that students are expected to be ready, respectful and safe passengers. The bus companies for the Ripon and Masham services have noted improved conduct. Thank you to parents for support with these important messages.
